



An update on Dartmouth and the town of Hanover's COVID policies:

We are looking forward to welcoming executive participants to the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth in Hanover, New Hampshire, this fall. We understand that you likely have many questions about the current local policies regarding coronavirus, so we have pulled together this resource to help guide you in your planning.

Hanover suspended its COVID-19 emergency public health ordinance during the week of June 22, removing masking and gathering restrictions. Dartmouth has also significantly eased its pandemic restrictions, largely due to an extremely high vaccination rate on campus (currently 80%), and in the local community.

Currently:

- Those who are fully vaccinated and have no COVID-19-like symptoms are no longer required to wear a face covering indoors or outdoors.
 - Individuals are considered fully vaccinated 14 days after their second dose in a two-dose series or 14 days after one dose in a single-dose series of a COVID-19 vaccine that has received full approval or emergency use authorization by the FDA or full approval or [emergency use listing by the World Health Organization](#).
 - Visitors who are fully vaccinated or who have tested positive and recovered from COVID-19 within 90 days of coming to Dartmouth may access Dartmouth campuses and buildings upon arrival.
- All physical distancing requirements have been lifted, and most spaces on campus can return to full capacity.
- All event and gathering limits have been removed.
- Unvaccinated visitors will still need to quarantine upon arrival.
 - Visitors who are not fully vaccinated and are arriving from outside New England must, upon arrival, wait 10 days to access Dartmouth campuses and buildings.
 - Visitors may shorten their 10-day waiting period or 10-day quarantine by taking a molecular (PCR-based) test five days after arrival. If their test result is negative and they continue to be symptom free, they may access campus once seven days have passed since their arrival. Visitors can access PCR tests at one of the locations listed on the state of New Hampshire's [testing resources page](#) or they can use [a PCR self-test kit](#).
 - Visitors may complete their waiting period or quarantine prior to traveling as long as they travel to Dartmouth using private transportation, making stops only to refuel.

Please keep in mind that this is an evolving situation. Current information regarding Dartmouth policies can be [viewed online](#) and Tuck Executive Education will continue to update you as restrictions ease or change.
